












District Councillor's Report



Cllr Patrick had sent his apologies with a written report

The main item of interest to the village was that the Recycle More scheme was now live with full details available at: www.somersetwaste.gov.uk. There had been some initial problems due to the shortage of qualified drivers but it was hoped that this would be resolved shortly.

County Councillor's Report

Cllr Keating stated he had no updates yet on The Hollow but he would update the councillor's as soon as the survey was received.

The proposed top dressing of the A30 from Uplands Terrace to the White Post garage would unfortunately cause further disruption. The rest of the road through West Coker is due to be resurfaced next year.

The decision on which unitary option had been chosen should be announced before 22 July.

He would update the Clerk if funding options became available for the play area.

Clerk's Report

The District and County Councils continued to provide assistance and information on the Covid situation and the village volunteers are still available if needed.

The Clerk had circulated plans for a chain of beacons to be lit to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee next year. Councillor Bussell thought that a bonfire had been set up on the hill in Broad Lane for a previous jubilee. Cllr Keating said that he would let the councillors know what was being planned by the County.

Details had also been circulated about a Zoom meeting organised by the Somerset Bus Partnership to discuss ways of improving the bus service and Cllr Bussell said that he would try to attend.

Cllr Smith had agreed to take over the position of Tree Warden.



COVID-19 BULLETIN

COVID - Staying Safe Now Restrictions Have Eased

Almost all legal coronavirus restrictions ended on 19 July. From now on, guidance is emphasising personal judgement and responsibility. People are expected to consider and manage their own risk and protect themselves and others through informed choice and by exercising common sense.

Coronavirus will be a feature of our lives for the foreseeable future, so we need to learn to live with it, but while cases are high and rising, everybody needs to continue to act carefully and remain cautious. Remember, there is a risk that you could catch or pass on the viurus, even if you are fully vaccinated.

Somerset's Public Health team is advising people to think carefully about continuing to keep the all-important 2 metre distance where possible.

As another measure to protect more vulnerable people, as well as workers in key services such as shops and pubs, it is recommended to continue to wear a face covering in indoor spaces such as in shops and on public transport. Pleease also continue to wash hands thoroughly and regularly. Meet up outside rather than inside and if inside, make sure to let the fresh air in by opening windows and doors.

Finally, it is important to:

- make sure to get both doses of the vaccine,
- self-isolate when required to do so; and,
- · use rapid tests twice a week.

Future Ready Fuel: working towards a lower carbon heating oil

For over 50 years, heating oil (kerosene) has been a popular choice for homes off the gas grid. As part of wider plans to tackle climate change and meet the UK's net zero target, the Government has pledged to prioritise converting off-grid



homes to low-carbon heating during the 2020s. In support of this, we're proud to be part of the UKIFDA and OFTEC Future Ready Fuel campaign, trialling a promising new renewable liquid fuel called HVO at one of our depots.

The challenge of decarbonising off-grid homes

Watson Fuels is working closely with organisations on the Future Ready Fuel campaign. Our shared goal is to find a low-carbon liquid fuel that will act as a drop-in replacement for kerosene.

How does HVO work with existing oil-fuelled heating systems?

Virtually all oil-fired boilers and heating systems can be adapted to run on HVO, once some simple modifications have been made. Compared to the expense of installing an entire new low-carbon heating system, these modifications can be far more affordable and straightforward.

As part of the nationwide Future Ready Fuel trials we've converted one of our own oil-fired boilers to run on HVO. HVO could also be a practical way to heat your home.

How you can get involved:

If you're keen to hear more about the progress of the Future Ready Fuel campaign or would be willing to take part in a trial, you can sign up to receive updates. Get involved through the Future Ready Fuel website.

UKIFDA and OFTEC are running a survey to gauge how many households are interested in switching to HVO. You can complete the short Future Ready Fuel survey online. Visit the Future Ready Fuel website to take part.

If you want to support the drive to low carbon heating but worry about the cost and lack of choice, you can write to or email your local MP.

Working with UKIFDA and OFTEC, we are hopeful that HVO will be approved by the Government as a route to decarbonise off-grid heating and introduced to the market in 2022.
