
Diane is inspired by the ever-changing weather of the Dorset coast, textures and colours and infuses these wonders in her work. She will also be painting at Eype each day.

July Parish Council Meeting


A combined report from County Councillor's Patrick and Hewitson was circulated.

Marquee: 20m x 7m - £90 for a maximum of 3 days

Gazebos: 3m x 3m with sides - £30 each for a maximum of 3 days

The gazebos can be easily erected by the hirer, however the marquee will be erected by Pat and his team but they will require at least 3 additional people (organised by the hirer) to assist in erection.

The hirer is required to ensure that they have adequate insurance cover in place to protect against damage or loss

FEOFFEES

FEOFFEES is the village poors land Charity which owns the Village Hall and Old School House as well as a field at the bottom of the village, currently leased to the Seyfrieds of Broad Lane.

The committee has representatives from the Church and Parish council as well as some independent worthies and monies are used for the benefit of the villagers of East Chinnock.

Currently we send vouchers to all villagers who have spent 2 nights in Hospital during the year and to those who have been bereaved during the year.

We propose to give vouchers to new parents in the village and would be grateful for notification of any new arrivals.

We are open to applications in case of hardship or anyone needing funds for extraordinary purposes. We are responsible for the upkeep of the Village Hall and Old School House and therefore may not always have large sums available.


Congratulations to the winning team: Elaine and Michael Seabrook and their daughter and her partner and Sharon and Paul Dodd.

We raised £214 which will be distributed between two Ukrainian charities: British-Ukrainian Aid and Nowzad Ukraine (animal charity).



We are praying for households in a number of streets in our village each month, covering all the streets over the year. Each household will receive a postcard letting them know we are praying for their street during that month.


In August we are praying for households in Weston Close and Underhayes Court.


General Meetings

WI Japanese Drums

If you heard a commotion coming from somewhere in East Chinnock on the evening of 13 July, you weren't imagining it! The WI welcomed Emma, an ex-music teacher from Shepton Mallet, to give a talk and demonstration on Japanese Taiko drumming. Emma's drums are smaller versions of actual Taiko drums which are lighter in weight.

Taiko drumming is centuries old, but ensemble, co-ordinated drumming dates from the 1950s. We all got to have a turn. All you needed was a pair of really thick drumsticks, known as bachi sticks, a drum and a "spot-on sense of rhythm".

Emma showed us the three main moves: big beats, scissor beats and "dongos". Some of us even got to drum a routine to Elton John's "I'm Still Standing".
