

Saturday Morning Café


Saturday pop up cafes take place on the first Saturday of each month and start at 10:30am at the Room@thePark, Portman Community Park.





A Note from the Reverend Colin Simpson

Some of you will have heard by now that I have been invited by the Bishop of Bath and Wells to become Rector designate of the parishes of Wellington and West Buckland near Taunton. This has come as something of a surprise to me, my family and the churches for which I



have been rector for the last seven and a half years. I thought my next move would be to retirement a couple of years from now. Apparently not.

For those of you who are unfamiliar with the workings of the Church of England there is a process in place to find a successor, though the timescale is unclear at present. In the meantime, if you are expecting to have your wedding or christening in one of the churches in the benefice they will still take place. Your Churchwardens will oversee all the arrangements and our administrator will be available to help. Your Churchwardens should also be contacted if a funeral needs to be arranged.

My last Sunday here will be 10 September 2023 when we will be having a service for me to say my goodbyes. Look out for details on church noticeboards.


