

The process for appointing a new Rector is well underway. The Parochial Church Council members, together with representatives of the other six parishes in the Coker Ridge Benefice, have met with the Archdeacon and the Bishop to better understand the process. The process requires the development of a Benefice Profile. It is to this end that Alex Swarbrick will work, with others, under the quidance of a representative of the Diocese. The draft profile should be finished by the end of November at which time it will be reviewed by the Diocese and the Patrons of the various parishes. An agreed profile will be the cornerstone of the advertisement for the post of

It is expected that the advert will be posted in mid-January with a closing date for applications at the beginning of February. If necessary, a short list will be drafted, with interviews arranged for the end of February. The interview panel will be formed of representatives of the parishes, the patrons and the diocese. A successful applicant will probably be required to serve a notice period of three months. It is therefore likely that the successful candidate will be in post during June 2024. If no applicant meets the needs of all the parishes we will take stock and revisit the process. In the meantime, we ask for your continued forbearance and support for all who are keeping St Mary's going to serve our community.




On 8 November the WI played host to David Morris, a most interesting speaker who has a passion for 'Shepherd's Huts and Living Vans', which was the title of his presentation and published book on the subject. David is also Curator of Aircraft at the Fleet Air Arm Museum and a Research Fellow at Bournemouth University.

David has spent many years researching shepherd's huts, finding evidence of their existence throughout history. They probably originated in France. Originally made from wood, wattle and daub, they were designed as a basic mobile shelter for shepherds or rural workers (and their dogs) to keep them close to their flocks of sheep. From the late 1880's they would have been made from corrugated iron.

The Chief Farrier to King James, Leonard Mascall, wrote in an agricultural guide, The Government of Cattle, in 1622: "In some places the shepherd has his cabin going upon a wheel for to remove here and there at his pleasure". This is evidence that shepherd's huts existed over 400 years ago. There is a reference in Thomas Hardy's novel Far From the Madding Crowd in 1874 "The image as a whole was that of a small Noah's Ark ... the hut stood on little wheels about a foot from the ground."

Living vans were built more sturdily, with larger ones holding several men to enable them to travel around a district to work. They evolved into the caravans that we know today. In recent years shepherd's huts have become a 'thing' and have been refurbished for modern-day camping.





ABBA Night - Thank You for the Music!

The WI monthly talk on 11 October was much anticipated and certainly drew a crowd. The WI's ABBA Superfan Sara Russell did not disappoint!

Charting the band's journey from being individual performers in the early 1970's, to the Eurovision where it all started, through to global


















Harvest Supper

The Harvest Supper took place at the Village Hall on 1 October. This is a regular community event. The sales table also raised some funds for The Lords Larder.


