The West Coker and Hardington Cricket Club, (formerly the Hardington and West Coker Cricket Club) are pleased to announce


that cricket will be played once again this season at the Recreation Ground, Halves Lane, West Coker, despite the wettest Spring for about 40 years!





WI Update

We had a TV celebrity in our midst at the WI meeting in April! 101 years old Bobby Bear. He featured as

one of the subjects for restoration on the BBC TV programme The Repair Shop. Bobby was the childhood toy of Joe Mack, who was an RAF Airman during World War II. Joe flew with one of the elite Pathfinder crews that were based in Cambridgeshire. The role of the Pathfinders was to precede bombing missions to identify targets.



East Chinnock WI

Joe was the sole survivor of an horrific plane crash on 16 December 1943. This date is known as Black Thursday due to the heavy loss of life on home soil because of bad weather, as opposed to any enemy fire or attack.

Bobby Bear helped Airman Joe through his convalescence after the crash. He was taken to the Repair Shop in 2019 by Joe's daughter, who visited the East Chinnock WI to tell Bobby's story. The photos show Bobby before and after the clever Teddy Bear Ladies on the show had worked their

magic. Their sympathetic restoration, using conservation mesh, has kept Bobby's character and history intact as well as his "lovely, wonky smile".

The May meeting included an interesting talk from two volunteers from the National Coastwatch Institute (a completely separate organisation from HM Coastquard).

Their mission is to assist in the protection and preservation of life at sea and along the UK coastline. They are the "eyes along the coast". They have 59 operational stations with our nearest two being at Charmouth and Lyme Regis. All 2,633 watchkeepers are

volunteers and the whole organisation is entirely self-funded from donations, fund raising and bequests. The staff even pay for their own uniforms!

These volunteers monitor and log all activity on the beach and at sea, plot positions of vessels, log the tides, weather, log any water sports or other

recreational activities. Any of this information could be used as evidence in the event of an incident. They work closely with the Coastguard, Search and Rescue services and the Police. This year so far 185 incidents have been reported.
