

#### **Parish Council News**

#### Training in Life-Saving



On 7 April at the Village Hall Sharon Kerwan from the Ambulance Service conducted a free demonstration of basic resuscitation techniques and how and when to use the defibrillator (which is housed in the Village Hall entrance).

Sharon demonstrated how to provide adult, child and infant life support. She explained the process to follow prior to commencing chest

compressions (CPR) and showed how the defibrillator works. The defibrillator itself provides an audio commentary instructing you on what to do, so the process is made as simple as possible. Guidance has been updated and there is no longer a requirement to give 'mouth to mouth' resuscitation to adults. There was also an



opportunity for attendees to practice CPR on dummies.



Nationally the chances of surviving a cardiac arrest outside of hospital is 10% - in this area it is 7%. Use of a defibrillator within 3 - 4 minutes of cardiac arrest increases the chances of survival to 76%.

The gazebos can be easily erected by the hirer, however the marquee will be erected by Pat and his team but they will require at least 3 additional people (organised by the hirer) to assist in erection.

\*\*\*The hirer is required to ensure that they have adequate insurance cover in place to protect against damage or loss\*\*\*
