



We understand this has been a long and frustrating wait, but rest assured we are moving things forward.


Household Support Fund







Church Concert

A memorable evening of music took place in St Mary's Church on 20 August. The musicians were two very talented villagers -Samantha Muir and Lara Taylor. The church was filled with the sound of the most beautiful music.

Samantha is a composer and performer, an Associate of the Royal College of Music London, a member of the Consortium for Guitar Research at Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge and is currently doing a PhD on classical ukulele at the University of Surrey. She specialises in the machete and the rajão which are the forerunners of the ukulele.

Lara has achieved a Performance Diploma in Classical Guitar (ATCL) from Trinity College London and has performed with the National Youth Guitar Ensemble. Lara recently completed a Masters degree in 18th Century Studies at Kings College London.

Samantha spoke about the history of the smallest of stringed instruments she played, a Machete de braga, which originates from Maderia, Portugal. The sound was exquisite and Samantha played five small pieces by Candido Drummond de Vasconceios, accompanied by Lara on guitar. She then played a couple of ukulele solos after giving a brief history of this instrument, which also originates from Portugal, although it has become more associated with Hawaii.

After a short interval, Lara and Samantha played a series of beautiful quitar duets.

Thank you to everyone who attended and helped to raise vital funds for the church, with special thanks to Samantha and Lara for a wonderful evening of entertainment.

St Marys Village Survey

People gathered at the Church Rooms on 4 September to hear the headlines from the St Mary's Village Survey. Out of a total of 270 households 13% responded. The aim of the survey was to identify what people value about the village, which things aren't so good and what other amenities people desire.

Suggested uses for the Church Rooms included an occasional community café and shop, as well as 'pub' nights. People who were enthusiastic to explore the café, shop and 'pub nights' were invited to get together to explore what will be involved. Some respondents suggested a 'café' outside of working hours and with that in mind, a Saturday Morning Cafe will run at the Church Rooms on the first Saturday of each month throughout winter. Rev Colin Simpson blessed the Church Rooms for their new purposes.

Ideas from the survey are being considered by the Parish Council, Village Hall Committee and the Feoffees, to make the village an even better place to live. Work is now underway planning the redecoration and refurbishment of the rooms and people volunteered to help with painting.
